Spanish Courses

Develop your skills through conversation, listening comprension, reading and writing.



Group (8 grammar lessons + 12 conversation lessons per week).

With a maximum of 8 students in each group class, we ensure that you receive personalized instruction, participate in class activities and discussions, and make a connection with your professor.

Private (16-20 private lessons per week).

Receive one-on-one attention. Private lessons are an excellent idea for students seeking a specialized vocabulary for specific situations and can be a more concentrated alternative to group classes.

Group + Private (8 grammar lessons + 8 conversation + 4 private lessons per week).

Supplement the standard mini-group class with additional private lessons. You may review a difficult area or focus on a specialized topic in your career or interests.

City Highlights


River-Boca fútbol: Watch impassioned porteños strive tirelessly for victory in Argentina's biggest rivalry. And those are just the fans.

City Highlights


Wine: Mendoza is the wine capital of Argentina, and there are many different vineyards where you can visit and sample some of the region's most famous wines.

City Highlights


Machu Picchu: Look more than 500 years into the past at the Incomparable Inca City. This wonder is accessible by foot and train from nearby Cusco.

Q: Will I find other students around my age?

Q: What can I do outside of class?

Q: Final advice before I leave?

- 3. Let us know if you are receiving any ongoing medical treatment.
- 4. Begin to train your ear to Spanish. If you have access to Spanish radio or TV stations, play them in the background when possible. Even if you are a beginner, just hearing people speak Spanish will help, whether or not you understand it.
- 5. As the saying goes, bring half the clothes you think you'll need, but twice the money.
